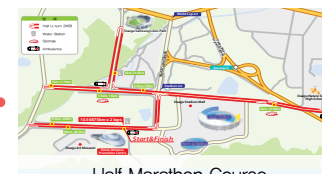

Competition Venues (Stadia)

The World Masters Athletics Championships Indoor Daegu 2017 will be mainly held at three venues, the Athletics Promotion Center, the Civil-life Sports Center and the Auxiliary Field of Daegu Stadium. These venues are within 5 to 10-minute walk from one another and 25 to 35-minute drive to Daegu's major transportation gateways, including Dongdaegu train station and Daegu International airport.

The Athletics Promotion Center, an indoor venue, is located at the leisure and cultural complex along with Daegu Stadium, Daegu Samsung Lions Park Baseball Stadium and Daegu Art Museum. Leisure facilities nearby include park, rock climbing gym, inline skating rink and Daegu Stadium Outlet, which has a theater, cafes, restaurants, shopping mall and large supermarket. These amenities allow visitors to enjoy shopping and leisurely activities all in one place.

Main Stadium (Athletics Promotion Center) —

The Athletics Promotion Center boasts state-of-the-art facilities, with an indoor track that includes warm-up and training areas, changing rooms, massage rooms, shower rooms, anti-doping test rooms, physical therapy rooms, medical facilities, emergency room, multimedia room, conference room, audiovisual room, lecture room, restaurant and lounge. The Athletics Promotion Center is considered as an origin of Korean athletics since it serves not only as a venue for track and field competitions but also for leaders training.

Auxiliary Stadium (Civil-life Sports Center) ●——●

The Auxiliary Stadium (Civil-life Sports Center) for the World Masters Athletics Championships Indoor Daegu 2017 is 5-minute walking distance from the Athletics Promotion Center. The Auxiliary Stadium, completed construction in 2016, will host field events, and will be utilized as an auxiliary (warm-up) stadium in conjunction with the Athletics Promotion Center. The Auxiliary Stadium will also serve as a multi-purpose sports and training center for athletes.

Winter Throwing Stadium (Auxiliary Field of Daegu Stadium)

The Auxiliary Field of Daegu Stadium will host winter throwing events during the World Masters Athletics Championships Indoor Daegu 2017. Located 15-minute walking distance from the Athletics Promotion Center, the Auxiliary Field of Daegu Stadium was a venue for matches in the 2002 FIFA World Cup Korea/Japan and it served as a warmup venue for the 2003 Summer Universiade Daegu and the IAAF World Championships Daegu 2011.

Cross Country Course

8km Cross Country will take place in 4 laps loop course of 2km in Suseong Family Park. The Suseong Family Park is an eco-friendly and family-friendly resting place with numerous sports facilities and recreation facilities including park golf course and a pool. The Suseong Family Park is 10-minute drive away from Athletics Promotion Center, the main stadium.

Road Race Walk Course

The 10km race walking is an event in which athletes compete on a section of the half marathon course. The race walking starts at the Athletics Promotion Center and loops around the Daegu Art Museum at the foot of Uksu Mountain. Runners must complete this 2km section, five times. The road conditions for the event are optimum for race walking.

Half Marathon Course

The half marathon course is a flat loop course which starts at the Athletics Promotion Center, along the road around Daegu Stadium, and goes past the recently opened baseball stadium (Daegu Samsung Lions Park), Athletics Promotion Center and the Daegu Art Museum. It is an eco-friendly course that features beautiful mountains, lakes, clean air and cool breezes for runners to enjoy.

Entry Requirements and Procedure



General Rules

The competition will be held under IAAF regulations as modified for Masters by WMA via their Competition Rules and any other special rules specified for this competition.



Entry

❖ General Information

Athletes may enter online or by using a paper entry form. Online is the preferred method of entry. See below for details about each method. All entries must include full payment to be considered valid. Athletes who cannot pay online must instead send a paper entry form and payment to their WMA National Masters Affiliate ("Affiliate"), which will then register them and pay on their behalf. The entry deadline is 24 January 2017 at 11:59 p.m. Korean Eastern Time. No entries will be accepted after the entry deadline. All entries are subject to validation by each athlete's respective Affiliate. Affiliates will confirm the athlete's date of birth, citizenship and/or residential qualifications and other relevant requirements. After an athlete's registration has been validated, its status will display as "accepted" on the list of entries online (www.daegu2017.or.kr). Athletes who have questions about the status of their entry should contact their Affiliate. For athletes who reside in a country where there is no WMA National Masters Affiliate or where the Affiliate fails to fulfill its obligations, their entries will be subject to the approval of the WMA Council.

❖ Online Entry Procedure

1. Go to www.daegu2017.or.kr and complete the online entry form prior to the entry deadline
2. Submit payment by credit card at the end of the entry process
3. Print the confirmation screen for your records
4. If you have not previously competed in a WMA championship, you must send a copy of your birth certificate to your Affiliate
5. Your Affiliate will then validate your registration

❖ Paper Entry Procedure

1. Contact your WMA National Masters Affiliate and request a paper entry form
2. Confirm the latest date required by your Affiliate for submission of your paper entry.
NB : Your Affiliate MUST input your entry and payment into the on-line system by the closing date of 24 January 2017 for it to be valid
3. Complete the entry form and make a copy for your records
4. Mail the completed entry form and all entry fees to your Affiliate prior to the entry deadline (do not send paper entry forms directly to the LOC). Paper entries sent to your Affiliate for processing MUST include all entry fees.

5. If you have not previously competed in a WMA championship, you must send a copy of your birth certificate to your Affiliate. Your Affiliate will submit your registration, pay on your behalf and validate your registration.

❖ WMA National Masters Affiliate Requirements

WMA requires that each Affiliate validate all relevant entries electronically via the online entry system. The Local Organizing Committee ("LOC") will accept only those entries that have been validated by Affiliates. Each Affiliate must also input any paper entries it receives from its athletes into the online entry system. Payment is required at the time the entries are submitted. If for some reason an Affiliate is unable to pay online, it must request an exemption from the LOC. If the exemption is granted, the Affiliate will be provided with details about how to pay offline. The Affiliate will still be required to input paper entries into the online entry system and to validate its entries electronically. All entries must be submitted online and paid before 24 January 2017 at 11:59 p.m. Korean Eastern Time. Any entries for which the LOC has not received payment by this deadline will be cancelled, and those athletes will be ineligible to compete. No exceptions will be allowed. In addition, all entries must be validated before 7 February 2017 at 11:59 p.m. Korean Eastern Time. Any entries that have not been validated by this deadline may be rejected, and those athletes will be ineligible to compete. Affiliates will receive communications regarding the entry process prior to the start of registration. Affiliates that do not receive these communications should contact the WMA Secretary.

❖ Qualifications for Entry

The World Masters Athletics Championships Indoor Daegu 2017 are open only to men and women who were born on or before 19 March 1982 and who are physically fit. Entry signifies that each competitor must follow the rules laid down by the technical and organizing committees. WMA has the right to reject entries to athletes considered to be ineligible through misconduct or other disciplinary related matters.

World Masters Athletics (WMA) has sanctioned Daegu City (LOC) to conduct the 2017 World Masters Athletics Championships (WMACi) in Daegu, South Korea during 19 to 25 March 2017.

❖ Disclaimer and Agreement for Use of Medical and Entry Data

I hereby apply for entry to the WMACi 2017 on the following terms and conditions which form a binding agreement between me, WMA and Daegu City.

- (1) I will abide by the IAAF rules and regulations as modified for WMACi by WMA via their handbook and any special rules specified for this competition which will be outlined on the Daegu 2017 website and communicated to competitors.
- (2) I am physically and mentally fit to compete in the WMACi safely and without causing injury to myself or other participants in the WMACi.
- (3) I agree and consent to accept medical treatment from Daegu LOC, WMA or their servants, agents or contractors, ambulance officers or medical personnel in the event that I am injured or otherwise become ill or incapacitated during the WMACi. In the event of any emergency medical treatment or services provided to me requiring the payment of fees, I agree to pay these fees upon request.
- (4) In consideration of WMA, Daegu City LOC are permitting me to participate in the WMACi, I agree to indemnify, hold harmless and release the WMA, Daegu City LOC and their employees, servants and agents, and all officials and volunteers from and against any injury, loss, damage, liability, cost, expense, demand, claim or action whether arising at common law or under statute that I may suffer or incur arising out of or in connection with my participation in the WMACi including as a result of the negligence, breach of statutory duty or any act or omission of WMACi Daegu City and their employees, servants or agents and all officials and volunteers.

If an exemption is refused, the prohibited substance(s) concerned must not be used and should you be selected for testing and the test proves positive this may result in a suspension. Please note that no other medical certificate(s) will be accepted in substitution for a TUE certificate. If you are granted a TUE exemption certificate, this must be with you at all times along with proof of identification, and must be produced at the Doping Control Centre if you are selected for a drug test. Details of prohibited substances and all Anti-Doping procedures are available on the IAAF (www.iaaf.org) website, the WMA (www.world-masters-athletics.org)

website and your IAAF Affiliated Federation. The Competitor's Handbook in Daegu will also contain details of the Anti-Doping Procedures to be undertaken during the championships.

General Information



Vaccinations and Travel Insurance

It is recommended for athletes, accompanying persons and persons concerned to obtain any required vaccinations and check whether their medical insurance covers travel and accidents in Daegu.

Accreditation

When reaching Daegu, all participants are requested to report to the Registration Desk at the main stadium, the Athletics Promotion Center, where they will be able to collect their registration package and other relevant information.

All athletes must present a passport or a government-issued photo identification to collect their accreditation and competition pack (entry booklet, AD card, BIB number). This is important as athletes will be automatically "Declared" for their event(s) when they register.

Accompanying persons and all persons receiving a credential of any kind also must present a passport or a government-issued identification to collect their credential and package. There will be no charges for team managers, medical teams, communications staffs who registered in advance. Such officials will be considered to have been certified by the Local Organizing Committee and the WMA.

The Registration Desk will open on Friday 17 March 2017 at 08:00 am.

Visa

As of October 14, 2015, 116 countries have visa-free entry or visa waiver agreements with South Korea. The athletes who are nationals of these countries are eligible for visa-free entry into Korea. The athletes and personnel from the nations that do not have a visa waiver program are required to obtain a visa before visiting Korea. The types of visa required will depend upon a person's citizenship, intended duration of stay and duties in relation to the event. All visa applicants are responsible for paying their own visa application fees.

Accommodation

- **Money Exchange** : Is possible at most major international airports and banks. Most banks have automatic teller machines which allow withdrawal of KRW from 07:00 till 23:00. They accept most major credit cards. Major credit cards are accepted at most stores and restaurants.
- **Restaurants** : Most are open daily. Dinner hours are usually from 18:00 to 21:00 although many fast food restaurants have late or 24 hour service.
- **Shops** : General hours are 10:00 to 22:00 although many convenience stores are open 24 hours. Wholesale marts (E-mart, Homeplus and Lotte-mart, etc) open from 10:00 till 24:00.

When you make a phone call to Korea from abroad, first dial 82(country code for Korea), then the area code(except for the first number 0). Finally, dial the phone number you wish to call
For example : Calling Daegu City LOC(area code 053) with 790-4125 as the phone number, dial +82-53-790-4125

- How to make an international call from Korea

As an international sports city, Daegu has successfully hosted the 2002 FIFA World Cup Korea-Japan, the 2003 Summer Universiade Daegu and the IAAF world Championships Daegu 2011. Major Tourist Attractions

Donghwasa Temple

Donghwasa is a Buddhist temple that boasts 1,500 years history. Built in the Silla period, Donghwasa is a major temple of Korean Buddhism and one of the top ten tourist spots in East Asia. It is a home of the world's largest Yaksayeoraebul statue, the medicine Buddha, created as a prayer for reunification of the Korean peninsula. Nearby is the International Tourist Attraction "Seon" Meditation Center, where visitors can learn about the history and principles of Korean Zen Buddhism. The temple also offers a temple-stay program, if you need to soothe stressed-out soul and relax through meditation.



Yangnyeongsi Oriental medicine Market

Daegu Yangnyeongsi is one of the three remaining medicinal herb markets in the country that dates back to the Joseon period (1392-1910). Each alley in the market is filled with scent of medicinal herbs and is brimming with a huge variety of medicinal herbs. The Daegu Yangnyeongsi Museum of Oriental Medicine, nestled in an alley, provides an insight into the history of herb medicine in Korea. It also features programs designed for visitors to experience traditional Korean culture, such as tasting medicinal herb teas, herbal foot bath, medicinal herb wrapping and wearing hanbok, the Korean traditional costume.



Dongseongno (Downtown)

Dongseongno is the most popular and trendy street in Daegu. It is lined with department stores, shopping malls, clothing and sporting goods stores, along with large bookstores, movie theaters, concert hall, restaurants and cafes.

Seomun Market

The largest traditional market in Daegu, the Seomun Market was one of the three largest markets in Korea during the Joseon period. It consists of six sections specialized in fabric-related items, including textiles and ready-to-wear clothing. It is also a place where you can buy virtually everything you need, such as street foods, fruits, seafoods, shoes, craft supplies and everyday necessities. The night market, which opened in May 2016, will add vitality to the city.



Suseongmot Resort (Deurangil Restaurant Street)

The area surrounding Suseongmot Lake is landscaped with benches, trees and walking trails. It is also crowded with cafes and restaurants famous for tasty dishes and outstanding service. The beautiful music fountain in the center of Suseongmot Lake is the largest of its kind in Korea. Nearby Deurangil Food Town is a must for foodies, featuring restaurants specialized in cuisines from around the world, including Korean, Western and Japanese food.



City Tour Bus



City tour buses, the smartest way to tour around Daegu, take visitors to major tourist spots in Daegu along a choice of five different routes. The double-deck tour bus offers a spacious upper deck for sightseeing. The tour that incorporates with Subway Line 3—opened in 2015 also known as "Sky Rail"—is another useful way to enjoy the sights of Daegu.

Daegu Alleyway Tour

Daegu alleyway tour is a walk tour which shows the alive history of Daegu through walking by the alleyways. The tour includes 5 different courses which shows live modern cultural heritage. The damage during the Korean war was comparatively less than other places. Therefore, conditions before and after the war are well preserved in each alleyway. Especially, at Kim Gwangseok-gil (street) which is a mural street built by numerous artists to commemorate the memory of deceased Kim Gwangseok, people can enjoy music and mural of him while walking by the street.
